Dear families,

We have had a busy four days of learning this week; please remember there is no school tomorrow- it is INSET day.

This week has been anti-bullying week, so on Monday we started with 'odd sock day'; this was to represent that we are all unique and different. In assembly, I talked to the children about how to tell if it is bullying; we discussed the difference between being mean, conflict and bullying. I also shared a word to help the children remember if it is bullying: STOP-stands for: Several Times On Purpose.

During the week, school council have been working on special anti-bullying posters; this afternoon we visited all classrooms to share our learning and support the children across school. I have been really impressed how well the children have engaged in talking about anti-bullying concepts.
