eading is the KEY to learning


Dear families,

This week we've been busy finalising new Individual Plans for each child on our SEND register. These plans help us to ensure that we are doing everything we can to support your child with their additional needs.


It's really important to us that you have a chance to contribute to your child's plan. So, if you haven't already heard from me, please keep an eye on your email for your invitation.








Excellent writing







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This week in the Ahlberg class, we have been extremely busy learning about 'me and my family,' which is our topic this half term. This includes learning about what a skeleton is and what it is made up of. The children have enjoyed having a go at

making a skeleton using straws and cotton buds. There has been a very big skeleton in our class which the children have been fascinated by. Do ask your children at home what a skeleton is, what it is for and what is it made from. The main book which has supported this teaching is 'Funny Bones' by Allen Ahlberg, which they have enjoyed thoroughly. They have also gotten very good at knowing where their different bones are in their body from singing dancing bones which can be found on YouTube.

VERY EXCITINGLY we have begun to teach phase 2 phonics which is the sounds of the letters, we call them phonemes. Please do ask your child the phonemes s and a. We will be learning t, p, i and n next week. A massive well done to all of the children who have read this week at home! Well done! Don't forget to read 5 times a week so you can get a special prize! Well done parents for supporting your child in this way!
